1. Eliminate Single-Use Water Bottles and Provide Water Refill Stations

Each year we have a water refilling station, where people can fill up their bottles with filtered water for free.



2. Eliminate Plastic Straws

We don't have signs that indicate this, but Bay of Islands Sailing Week doesn't provide plastic straws or any kind of straws in our bar.



3. Serve Food with Plastic-Free Dinnerware

All our food vendors were serving their food in cardboard boxes or serviettes and used bamboo cutlery that can be hot-composted. If plastic containers were used for sauces, they were number 1 plastic, that can be recycled when cleaned. Bar was using number 1 plastic cups donated by Northland Cleaning Supplier and we encouraged sailors to reuse them as much as possible and then recycle. We would also, where possible, encourage people to use original drink cans and bottles, instead of using cups.

4. Use or Provide Reusable Bags

Our long term sponsor and supporter Gurit provided water-proof reusable bags for our registration to give out to participants.





5. Award Practical Items or Use a Perpetual or Upcycled Trophy

All our trophies were made form upcycled wood by a local company. We always provide practical items or gift-vouchers for services as spot prizes, to ensure they get used accordingly instead of ending up in a landfill. Some examples: hats, Sol and Sea sunscreen (eco friendly), t-shirts, torches, olive oil, reusable water bottles, dry bags, haul out services, fenders etc.




6. Publicize Your Sustainability Efforts

Throughout the event we share our passion and efforts for sustainability and encourage all the participants and volunteers to take part in conscious choices. On our website, people can read our

clean regatta goals as well as how they can help us to be a sustainable event. As well as we proudly display the certificates at our event race hut.




7. Involve Local Organizations

Our event always involve as many local businesses as possible, because we all share love for our beautiful Bay of Islands. Just to mention few of them:

- We have help from our local Resilient Russell team to manage recycling and compostable items.
- Our trophies are made by a local company Romeyn Woodcrafts, that uses recycled wood.
- The official range of Bay of Islands Sailing Week gear provided and sold by DD Gold from Kerikeri.
- Opua General store provides lunches to racers and volunteers.
- Food vendors from Opua, Pahiha and Kerikeri were providing meals each day.
- Our volunteers and sailors stay in local accommodation across Russell, Opua and Paihia, as well as use local tourism operators.
- Security, event gear hire, sound and light provider, music bands, waste refusal and portaloo emptying is done by/from the Bay of Islands companies.





8. Post Educational and Reusable Signage

All our signs are laminated and reused every year, unless they have been damaged and need replacing. This year we had a new venue, which meant some signage had to be replaced, but most of it was still usable even in the new venue as we have made them universal (without year and location on them).



9. Serve Local Food or Source Seafood Sustainably

Our food vendors were local caterers from Opua, Paihia and Kerikeri: 2BrokeGurlz Catering, Archies Burgers, Ze Foodies, Betty's Coffee, It's Just A Donut and Bay of Islands Yacht Club with their fundraiser breakfast bacon butties for their youth sailing program.



10. Organize a Green Team

We had a great volunteer team from Resilient Russell that worked as waste management & recycling ambassadors for the 2024 BOI Sailing week. Each evening they were monitoring all of our 4 recycling station helping sailors to locate waste in the right bins.

11. Ensure Proper Waste Bin Placement and Signage

We had in total 4 recycling/waste stations, that included – general waste, organic (compostable) waste, commingled, green glass, brown glass and clear glass bins. Some of them had EcoSolutions lids for ease of use and signage that indicated what is supposed to be thrown in each bin. Signs were reused from previous years and other events.

12. Divert Food Waste from the Landfill

In our waste/recycling stations we had a dedicated bin for organics — all the bamboo cutlery, cardboard plates, paper serviettes and food waste. After the event Resilient Russell team collected all organic waste and it was hot-composted in their facilities in Russell.

Here is the waste audit from your event held in Opua between 23 - 26 January.

The quantities are measured from the 240 litre wheelie bins they were collected in except for the cardboard which was collected in a 3m3 (3000 litre) bin.


General Waste 1045 litres
Cardboard 2550 litres
Co-mingled recycling 1760 litres
Clear glass 820 litres
Green glass 550 litres
Brown Glass 110 litres
Compostables 1130 litres

Total volume in 2024 = 7,965 litres **Diverted from landfill = 6,920 litres**Diverted from landfill = 86.9%

The amount diverted from landfill is 6,920 litres or 6.92 cubic metres or the equivalent of 6,920 one litre plastic bottles.

13. Use Paperless Event Management

Week) for the sailors and have them available online. As sometimes last minute changes are required, it makes it also more efficient and sustainable to do the updates, without re-printing hundreds of booklets. We use our own Bay of Islands Sailing Week App, and for communication we use WhatsApp Groups for the committee, sailors and volunteers. Any paper from office waste after/during the event was recycled or put in compostables as per Resilient Russell instructions.



14. Host a Beach or Marina Clean-up

In 2023, before the regatta itself, we teamed up with local enthusiasts (project Ocean Mind and EcoHive) who do regular monthly beach clean ups in Paihia and organized a Bay Wide Rubbish Blitz across the Bay of Islands — Paihia, Opua, Okiato and Russell. This was supported by SeaCleaners, who picked up all the rubbish and disposed it accordingly and Northland Waste which provided us with rubbish bags. Local cafés were supporting the event by providing free coffee for all the volunteers involved in the cleanup, as well as providing spot prizes. On our social media we encouraged our followers to participate in the blitz even if they weren't in the area and send us pictures with their finds to win spot prizes. Lot of different and unexpected waste was found during the cleanup. The blitz was great success, and we are intending to make it a tradition each year before the event.



15. Promote Alternative Transportation

We encourage people to carpool to the Marina or walk/bike if they are staying close enough as it helps alleviate the parking problems in Opua too. During the event a shuttle taxi was provided by a local company Haruru Cabs for the afternoons from 4pm to 10pm, for special - \$15 return ticket between Opua and Paihia.



16. Increase Awareness of Wildlife and Habitat Protection

We informed all the sailors on Bay of Islands Marine Mammal Sanctuary Restrictions via our website https://bayofislandssailingweek.org.nz/bay-of-islands-marine-mammal-sanctuary-restrictions/.

While Bay of Islands Sailing Week was granted an exemption to the restrictions for racing, sailors still had to be aware of the restrictions in force throughout the Bay and adhere to them while not racing in the regatta. Harbour Master provided info leaflets together with digital info sheets on speed regulations, Marine Mammal Sanctuary Restrictions, and areas where sailors are not allowed to anchor as exotic Caulerpa is spotted.



17. Offer Vegetarian or Vegan Alternatives

Our food vendors were providing vegetarian alternatives where possible – vegetarian quesadillas, tacos and hangi.

18. Use Eco-Smart Race Management Techniques

All race management is via the website/app, so notices are posted as push notifications and web posts during the event, instead of printing it out to all the sailors (screenshot of push notifications on app attached). We were using WhatsApp group for committee boats to communicate results back to regatta HQ. As well as race officers were emailing the results to results@bayofislandssailingweek.org.nz for the Results person to manage.



19. Prevent Toxins from Entering the Water

We advise all competitors about marine discharge rules and pump out facilities, and specifically prohibit the use of ties & bands for spinnakers in our sailing instructions, as well as ask to retain all rubbish until sailors return to shore (and use Marina waste stations instead of event venue stations), and keep absorbent oil spill pads handy when refuelling.

20. Encourage Green Boating Practices

We encourage sailors to follow green boating practices by:

- Minimizing their on-board waste
- Refill their water bottles for FREE at our water refilling station
- Separating recyclables, compostables and general waste

- Not discharging any waste into the ocean.
- Downloading the BOISW App to access the Sailing Instructions.

We do this by having it on our website, communicating via emails and across social media. As well as we advise all competitors about the clean hull requirements they need to comply with to attend the regatta, i.e. proof of recent antifoul or lift & scrub, as per local authority requirements.

21. Bonus Opportunities

- We are lucky to have great sponsors, like New World Kerikeri, who supplied fresh fruit for our volunteers.
- New World Kerikeri and Roadrunner Tavern in Opua supplied our bar with drinks and both were happy to take back unused/unopened bottles, that way limiting waste.
- We have started conversations on having reusable cups for next regatta and have washing station available from EcoSolutions.
- We advised our followers on social media on Rubbish Barge that will operate in Bay of Islands over summer.
