The future of the oceans is in our hands and Oyster are committed to becoming the world's most sustainable yacht business, delivering experiences, adventures under sail with a positive impact on the planet.

We continue working towards our 2030 goal of producing a luxury sailing yacht in the most sustainable manner possible.

We recognise our responsibilities and are taking an ambitious approach to minimising our environmental impact by setting clear and achievable sustainability goals. As part of this, we have reviewed every aspect of our operations to minimise waste, reduce energy use and plastic consumption, whilst also considering the materials we use to manufacture our yachts.

Oyster are proud to be working with Sailors for the Sea across a number of our events such as Regattas and Oyster World Rally, to minimise the impact the event and the participants that attend them have on the environment.

After achieving Platinum certification at the Oyster Palma Regatta 2022, 2023 and 2024, our aim is to maintain this at all future Palma Regattas going forward.

Best Practice 1 - Eliminate Single-Use Water bottles and provide refill stations

We communicated to participants prior to the Regatta that there would be no single-use plastic at the event and asked that they bought their own reusable water bottles to use throughout the regatta.

We placed a Cleanwave water refill station on the dock at Port Adriano so participants could refill their reusable water with drinking water.

All caterers were briefed not to serve any single use plastic items.

Best Practices 2 & 3 -Eliminate Plastic Straws / Serve Food with Plastic-Free Dinnerware

All drinks were served without straws during the regatta events.

All caterers involved with the regatta had to use environmentally friendly sound alternatives to single-use plastics. All drinks were served in glasses or reuseable plastic cups and food was served on reusable dinnerware. At dock parties, beer was served in glass bottles and aluminium cans which were recycled.

Best Practice 4 – Skip Bags or Go Reusable

Our Regatta partner B&G provided yacht owners with a waterproof dry bag for all yachts to use throughout the week and in the future.



Best Practice 5 – Award Practical Items or use a Perpetual or Upcycled Trophy

ENSURING A CLEAN REGATTA

To help us meet the criteria for the Clean Regatta Certification and stand by Oyster's sustainability goals, we will be promoting a number of initiatives.

- No single-use plastics: we will ensure all caterers and suppliers use
 environmentally friendly and sound alternatives to single-use plastics.
 Reusable Oyster Regatta branded cups will be issued in each skipper's bag
 during registration, for use throughout the week. For on-the-water hydration
 solutions, The Rigging Point are sponsoring the Cleanwave Refill Water
 Fountain for participants to refill their water containers and bottles every
 day.
- Paperless regatta: to reduce our paper waste, we will share all regatta documentation digitally, either via email or the Oyster Events app.
- Recycling: we will be recycling any waste made by the team and participants throughout the regatta by using the Port Adriano recycling bins on the dock, and encourage participants to do the same.
- Supporting local organisations: we are once again supporting local organisations, including the Save The Med Foundation a charity to help regenerate biodiversity in the Mediterranean, Cleanwave Foundation who initiate community projects to save land and sea conservation, and Yachting Gives Back who take any uneaten food and distributes it to the local homeless community.

These simple steps will help us to reduce our impact on the environment during the regatta, and we hope to achieve another platinum certification in 2025.

Save The Med are a marine conservation organisation based in the Balearic Islands focussed on regenerating the Mediterranean Sea. Their main focus is marine protection and pollution reduction. Best Practice 8 - Post Educational and Reusable Signage


All educational signage was posted electronically to help aid our 'paperless' approach.



Best Practice 12 – Divert Food waste from landfill

We worked with local organisation Yachting Gives Back run by Nick Entwhistle. They collected left-over regatta lunches at the end of each race day to donate to local homeless shelters. This helped to divert waste from landfill.







Best Practice 13 – Use Paperless Event Management

All regatta documents were shared through the Oyster Regatta webpage and Whatsapp group, none were printed, which reduced a huge amount of paper waste at the event.

We believe 400 + sheets of paper were saved by using the app instead of printing race documents.



Best Practice 14 - Host a Beach or Marina clean up

Oyster is proud to be working with Port Adriano marina who are passionate and committed to sustainability and who are actively making a difference. Here are the initiatives they run and organisations they support including regular Save the Med beach clean ups. These endeavours were communicated and promoted to our regatta participants.

For 4 out of 5 days during this regatta, all evening events were located on site so transportation was not used thus reducing emissions considerably.

The racing courses were kept nearby and time motoring to the startline was minimised.
